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Mrs. Harding shared with the board that the state auditors have not been in for the FY23 audit. However, she has received a letter that they will not be able to do our audit due to being short staffed for the period of FY24 through FY28. They will handle bidding it out and awarding the contract. In addition, we were also successful on our bus auction and all but one bus has been picked up. All funds have been received by GovDeals. Finally, Allison Anderson sent an email that the Nexus Pipeline had settled their case at the board of tax appeals and that the ruling was not in their favor. Rover Pipeline has the same type of tax issue and they were waiting to see what would happen to Nexus. This would mean they would have to pay what is still owed. However, Allison heard that they were meeting with schools to negotiate down what they owe.
